Yes you accept the proxy. Bahamas has given proxy to El Salvador. Do you accept? Yes. Belize has given proxy to Uruguay. Do you accept? You accept, thank you. Guam has given proxy to Uzbekistan. Do you accept? Yes. Honduras has given proxy to Costa Rica. Do you accept? Yes. Malta has given proxy to Spain. Does Spain accept? Yes. Niger has given proxy to Guinea. Guinea is not here. So, the second federation is Mali. Does Mali accept the proxy of Niger? Yes. Puerto Rico has given proxy to Virgin Islands. Do you accept? Yes. Rwanda has given proxy to Senegal. Does Senegal accept? Yes. San Marino has given proxy to Portugal. Does Portugal accept? Yes.

Is there any federation who has not received a voting set? Is there any federation having a proxy but not having two voting sets?

I will repeat the proxies. Albania has given proxy to Italy, does Italy have two voting sets? Ok. Antigua y Barbuda has given proxy to Guatemala, does Guatemala have two voting sets? Guatemala, do you have two voting sets? Bahamas has given proxy to El Salvador, do you have two sets? Ok. Belize has given proxy to Uruguay, Uruguay has two voting sets? So I repeat the names of the federations who are not here. Botswana is not here. Brunei is not here. Congo is not here. Cameroon is not here. Dominican Republic is not here. Guinea is not here. Nigeria is not here.

Dominican Republic has arrived. We have now one hundred and thirty-six federations present or represented.

And now we move to item two. Ladies and gentlemen, the President.

## 2. Address by the President of the FIE

---

**Alisher Usmanov (RUS):** Good morning everybody. Dear guests, dear delegates and dear friends, I welcome you in Moscow and because we have our congress, our election congress, I would like to tell you a couple of words before the elections of the new leaders of our federation for the next Olympic cycle. The past four years gave new impulse, direction and substance to the work of our federation. And I am grateful to the Executive Committee members, Commissions members and Directorate, and of course personally to Nathalie Rodriguez, our CEO. Our teamwork and efforts were critically important for our success and achievement to develop fencing all over the world.

Our main challenge today is to turn the initial success into new achievements. For sure we must continue our fight for two Olympic medals. We shall also significantly modify our rules to make fencing more visible and exciting and to bring fencing back to its roots.

We need to elect the best leadership team for our federation. And I know that you will make your decisions seriously, with responsibility. And I hope, I am sure we will elect the best candidates. I wish to everybody success and good time in Moscow.

And I ask Nathalie to chair the work of our congress.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Thank you Mister President. Ladies and gentleman I would like to announce that we have very important authorities with us, and first of all, I would like to call Mister Pavel Kolobkov, who is Deputy of the Russian Federation Minister of sport.

**Pavel Kolobkov (RUS):** Good morning ladies and gentlemen. I would like to thank the President and I will read the address of the Minister of Sports: "I welcome everyone here at the FIE Congress. Fencing is one of the most ancient and refined sports. This FIE congress which takes place here from December 7 to 9, gather more than 300 representatives of one hundred thirty six federations. This is a lot. It is here in Moscow that you will determine the future main ways of the development of fencing in Russia but also all over the world. I am very glad of this. So the growth of fencing visibility and its attractiveness is very important for us. I wish all participants of the Congress all success and a productive work."

I would like to say a few words from me personally. I am a former Olympic champion and I belong to your community, I am very happy that this Congress be held in Moscow and of your work to develop our sport and to send your athletes to all our competitions. We will develop fencing because fencing is our priority and has huge perspectives. I wish you success in your work and at the Congress. Thank you.

**Maxim Paramonov (UKR):** Dear guests, dear colleagues, let me announce another high eligible person who will present a speech, Mister Alexei Vorobiev, Head of Moscow City Department on Physical Culture and Sport.

**Alexei Vorobiev (RUS):** Dear Mister President of the International Fencing Federation, Mister Usmanov. Ladies and gentlemen, please allow me to welcome you in the Capital of the Russian Federation, in the name of the Moscow Department and in my personal name. Moscow is the key sports city of this country. In this congress of the FIE in Moscow, many federations are present and this contribute to the development of the sport. I wish you a very constructive Congress. I can see that you are all in a high and constructive spirit and I wish you all the best in your work, Moscow will always welcome you and we will always expect you in Moscow. Thank you.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Thank you. Mister Vladimir Vasin, who is Honorary Vice-President of the Russian Olympic Committee.

**Vladimir Vasin (RUS):** Dear ladies and gentlemen, Dear Mr President. As a former Olympic Champion, and on behalf of the Executive Board of the Olympic Committee of Russia, I am happy to welcome you in Moscow. 2012 is coming to an end, and it was a very special year for the sports community because of the Olympic Games in London. We now try to finalise and to look at the results. Thank you for organising your congress in Moscow. Fencing is a priority sport in the Olympic program and in the Russian federation. Fencing is a remarkable sport, and we are sure that you will evaluate the achievements of your sport and its perspectives. I hope that the number of medals in fencing will increase at the Olympic Games. I wish you a nice stay in Moscow, and a constructive work in view of the development of fencing world. Thank you.

### 3. Ratification of the new federations

---

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** I wish to inform you that Nigeria arrived. Nigeria should receive a voting set. We have now one hundred thirty seven countries.

First of all, all items on the agenda, except the elections, will be done by electronic voting. You will remember that you have to press one for yes and than valid, two for a no and then valid, and three for abstention and then valid. Each time you vote, you have to press valid. You have received an explanatory document. I will open the vote and then close the vote.

So we move to item three, which is the ratification of the new federations. During this year, we have affiliated Madagascar, Mauritius, Jamaica, and this week we have affiliated Rwanda.

The vote is open. Remember: one for yes, two for no, and three for abstention.

The vote is closed.

The new federations are approved.

## 5. 2011-2012 report of the Executive Committee

---

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Again, we did not receive any remark on that report so I suggest to... Yes, Mister Van de Flier?

**Bert Van de Flier (NED):** Thank you. I read it last night and I have a small remark. I noticed on page 6, on the top of page 6, that there were seven candidates in epee, and eleven of them passed. Maybe it should be seventeen candidates, not seven. It should be checked.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** It will be checked and corrected. Thank you. So, with this remark, we will move to the vote on the annual report.

The vote is open.

The vote is closed.

The annual report is approved.

**Maxim Paramonov (UKR):** Dear friends let me announce something about the annual report. Everybody knows that this year our federation suffered the loss of several very important persons and friends. This year we lost Merih Sezen (TUR) , Vratislav Janda (CZE), Vladimer Aptsiauri (GEO), Edoardo Mangiarotti (ITA, MH), Mark Petrovitch Midler (RUS), Arun Kumar Vij (IND), Carol Wengraf (GBR), Fady Tannous (LIB). We express our deepest sympathy to the families, and federations of the deceased. I invite you to commemorate their memory.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** So for the next items I give the floor to the treasurer, Peter Jacobs.



## 6. Financial report, study of the accounts for 2011/2012, report of the auditors

---

**Peter Jacobs (GBR, MH):** Good morning ladies and gentlemen. I will now go through the various aspects of the financial reports. To begin with our results for the financial year, from July 2011 until June 2012. First of all, with the income and expenditure account, where our results were better than we had budgeted, and with an excess of income over expenditure of roughly 92,000 Swiss francs. And we were therefore able to spend more money on development plan for the confederations and federations, supported particularly by the donations from the president and his generosity as usual. And so this is a satisfactory result for the year. The results when we come to our balance sheet, for the end of last year, as financial condition was fully satisfactory to maintain the long-term reserves, as requested and supported by the president. And with the income and expenditure budgeted for the forthcoming period, to maintain the FIE finances in a healthy state. So the result for the year, was I think, fairly satisfactory. The auditors in analysing our accounts, were also completely satisfied with the state of our accounting system and our financial report according to Swiss law for this twelve months period, and therefore gave us a completely clean bill of health once more with which we are very happy.

Unless anybody has anything specific to ask, I would suggest that we move immediately, if you are content with that, to approve the accounts for the last financial year.

## 7. Approval of the accounts, discharge to the Executive Committee and to the auditors

---

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** The vote is open.

**Peter Jacobs (GBR, MH):** I should add that I will ask you at the same time to therefore discharge the Executive committee and the auditors of their responsibilities obviously in relation for these accounts in your approval.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** The vote is closed.

We approved the accounts and discharged the Executive committee and the auditors. We move to item eight.

## 8. Budget for 2013/2014

---

**Peter Jacobs (GBR, MH):** I will give a little more explanation. This budget for 2013-14 approved by the Executive Committee in September, assumed we would receive a 11.7 million Swiss francs, from the IOC for the London Games, which was considerably higher than we estimated one year ago when we made the budget for 2012-13. So, this new budget for 2013-14, together with the revised estimate for 2012-13, proposes with this Olympic moneys together with the continuous and very generous donations of the president on other revenues of FIE raises, to increase our long-term reserves by 6.5 million Swiss francs, to increase slightly the development plan expenditure and supporting competitions of the FIE, and to fund the centennial celebrations of the FIE in 2012-2013, helped by a very generous additional donation from the president. And finally to balance our books over the next Olympiad. To show this more clearly, some of the moneys in budget are put into what we have called a short-term reserve, to be released over each year of the Olympiad, in order that you can see each year more clearly in the future, how this is being achieved.

For the good news in fact, is that the IOC moneys from London have been even more generous than was budgeted, we now have slightly more than 13 million Swiss francs received from the IOC. So we are happy indeed about this. And with these good news, I will ask you to approve the FIE's budget for 2013-2014. Thank you.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** The vote is open.

**Maxim Paramonov (UKR):** Just to put your attention on the fact that, all of us, a most impressive majority of us, can remember the amount of budget that we had during previous years, before 2008. It looks like it is considerably higher than it was previously. And it looks like we managed all this money well. I hope so. So, we are looking for the approval of this budget. Thank you.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** The vote is closed.

The budget is approved.

## 9. Designation of the auditors

---

**Peter Jacobs (GBR, MH):** And finally, almost finally... As ever, I ask you to approve for next year, the continuation of Ernst & Young as our auditors, which we are obliged to do every year according to our statutes. So please, will you approve Ernst & Young to continue as the auditors of the FIE?

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** The vote is open.  
The vote is closed.

The auditors are approved for next year.

**Peter Jacobs (GBR, MH):** And finally, I would like to say that this concludes the financial component of this 2012 congress. I thank you for your attention, and this also, in fact, ends my last presentation to you as treasurer of the FIE. May I thank you all for your support, for your cooperation and friendship with me, in my work, over the last 12 years. Thank you.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** We now move to item ten, which is the vote to award the World Championships.

For the 2013 Junior and Cadet World Championships, we have received the candidature of Poreč, Croatia. The dates will be 6 to 15 of April 2013.

You will remember that we sent you an urgent letter on this issue, saying that by accepting Poreč, you will also accept first to hold each weapon on two days, the preliminaries on the first day and the table of 32 on the second day. And, second, that the World Championships will last ten days, in total, instead of the usual 9 days. So, if you agree on this, we will move on to the vote.

**Hadiwijoyo Rohmad (INA):** Yes, Indonesia is willing to be candidate for the 2014 World Championships, in Bali and Indonesia.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** So, Bali Indonesia is candidate for the 2014 Junior and Cadet World Championships.

Then, is there any candidate for the 2015 Senior World Championships?

**Alexander Mikhailov (RUS):** The Russian Fencing Federation wants to be candidate for the Senior World Championships 2015.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Will it be in Moscow? Is Moscow candidate? Ok.

**Alexander Mikhailov (RUS):** I think it will be in Moscow.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Is there any other candidate?

**Donald Anthony (USA):** Thank you. The United States of America would like to be a candidate for the 2015 World Championships. We are looking at a number of cities including Washington DC, Philadelphia and possibly New Orleans, Louisiana.

**Alisher Usmanov (RUS):** I am especially grateful to the United States Federation because of the promise of the US Olympic Committee and National Fencing Federation. Thank you very much, you did not forget your promise to me in Philadelphia. Thank you.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Is there a third candidate? No. Thank you.

Then for the 2014 Veteran World Championships I have received the candidature of Mauritius, in the city of Port Louis, and the dates will be in October. Is there any other candidature? Yes?

**Sam Cheris (USA, MH):** The United States will present a candidature for 2014 and we will give you a list of places later on.

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Thank you very much. So for the 2014 Veteran World Championships, we have two candidates Mauritius and U.S.A.

We have finished with that part of the agenda, and now we will move to the elections.

**Yiannis Hadjarapis (CYP):** Good morning. Nice to see you. I am the representative of Cyprus I want to ask: is the voting compulsory?

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** The voting compulsory? No. The vote is a right and not an obligation.

**Yiannis Hadjarapis (CYP):** So a federation can vote yes, no, or abstention, and the fourth one is blank?

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Yes 3 possibilities, yes, no and abstention.

**Yiannis Hadjarapis (CYP):** So the total number of voters is 137?

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Yes. The total number is 137.

**Yiannis Hadjarapis (CYP):** So if some people do not vote, it is blank?

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** Yes, it is blank.

## 12. Elections

---

**Nathalie Rodriguez:** So we move to the elections. And we will start with the election of the President. The election of the President must be effectively held, even with one candidate, because our statutes provide that the President, the Executive Committee and the commissions must be elected. You will receive a voting slip. Please put a cross in front of the name of the candidate. No zero, no V, it must be a cross, as written on the voting slip.

Twelve federations can vote at the same time since we have twelve voting booths, six on this side, and six on the other side. I will request the federations which are placed on my left to go to the voting booths which are here. And to the federations which are placed on my right to go to the voting booths which are here. Is everything clear?

As we are a lot of people in the room, when you have finished to vote please take your seat, or if you want to have a coffee, please go outside. If everybody is standing and walking, we will not be able to see the federations coming to vote. Of course, the commissions are absolutely independent, they can elect who they want. And one more time, I want to tell you this: It is only the first step to change the image of our

federations, to change the image of fencing and have the spectators come back to our competitions. For anyone who loves fencing, this must be the target number one. And thank you again for your confidence to me, thank you again for your support, and welcome to Moscow. I invite everybody to the gala dinner to relax. Enjoy the Russian hospitality... Thank you very much.

## OBITUARIES

The International Fencing Federation has suffered the loss of several friends:

### **Merih SEZEN (TUR)**

Passed away in Istanbul, at the age of 93. (12.12.2011)

Merih SEZEN competed in many World Championships, and was a member of the Turkish sabre team at the 1948 London Olympic Games.

He was a long-time member of the Turkish Fencing Federation, as well as one of its founders.

He was also several times member of FIE commissions and recipient of the FIE medal of honour.

### **Vratislav JANDA (CZE)**

Doctor of Law, he was born on 04.08.1929, and passed away on 28.11.2011. He was:

- an Honorary Member of the Czech Fencing Federation;
- a member of CSK Riegel Praha (fencing club founded in 1902, and co-founder of the FIE in 1913) for the entirety of his career beginning in 1953 ;
- individual national epee champion in 1960, 1961, 1964 and 1967, the individual national foil champion in 1965, and member of several CSK Riegel national champion teams;
- a representative of Czechoslovakia for many years, both in foil and epee;
- a referee for many years and a member of the Executive Committee of the Czech Fencing Federation;
- President of the Czech Fencing Federation from 1964 to 1967

### **Vladimer Aptsiauri (GEO)**

Passed away unexpectedly on May 14, 2012. He was Olympic team foil champion at the Seoul (KOR) Olympic Games in 1988, and team foil world champion in 1982 in Rome (ITA). He also was Vice-President of the Georgian Fencing Federation.

### **Edoardo Mangiarotti (ITA, MH)**

Deceased on May 24, 2012, in Milan, in his 93<sup>rd</sup> year.

Edoardo Mangiarotti was a prodigious athlete, as well as a very talented leader.

In 1959, the FIE Congress granted Edoardo Mangiarotti the Challenge Chevalier Feyerick trophy, with the following special mention:

"Exceptional fencer, who never failed to lead by example with his physical and moral qualities during his very long career adorned with the most prestigious titles, and who knew how to harmoniously blend a pure classical style of fencing with elegance and an ever-present fair play attitude".

The FIE President, M. Gian Carlo Brusati (ITA, MH), named him Secretary General at the 1980 FIE Congress.

In 1984, the FIE Congress granted him the title of Member of Honour of the FIE.

He was also President of the FIE Scale of Votes Commission and President of the FIE Disciplinary Commission from 2000 to 2008.

Born on April 7, 1919, Edoardo Mangiarotti was an outstanding specialist in both foil and epee. Junior Italian champion from the age of 11, he started fencing at an international level at the age of 16 and participated in his first World Championships in 1935.

His record of achievements is impressive:

Olympic Games: 6 gold medals, 5 silver medals and 2 bronze medals;

Berlin 1936 (gold medal), London 1948 (2 silver medals, 1 bronze), Helsinki 1952 (2 gold, 1 silver), Melbourne 1956 (2 gold, 1 bronze), Rome 1960 (1 gold, 1 silver).

World Championships: 15 gold medals, 7 silver medals and 5 bronze medals.

### **Mark Petrovitch Midler (RUS)**

Deceased May 31, 2012, at the age of 80.

Russian foilist, he was a team foil Olympic champion both in Rome in 1960 and in Tokyo in 1964.

He won six consecutive team World Championships in foil: Budapest in 1959; Turin in 1961; Buenos Aires in 1962; Gdansk in 1963; Paris in 1965 as well as Moscow in 1966. He also won the

team foil silver medal in 1967. In individual foil, he won the silver medal at the 1957 World Championships and bronze medals in 1959 and 1961. He also was the coach of the Russian Olympic team.

### **Arun Kumar Vij (IND)**

Deceased on June 30, 2012, at the age of 62.

Arun Kumar Vij was engaged in promoting fencing not only in India, but also in all of South-East Asia, supporting and advising all federations in this region. He had an outstanding career as international sport leader: he was co-Secretary of the Indian Olympic Committee, Secretary General of the Indian Fencing Association, Secretary General of the South-East Asia Fencing Federation, member of the Asian Fencing Confederation and Vice-President of the Commonwealth Fencing Federation. He played a very important role in organising the first Junior Commonwealth Championships in Chennai, India, in 2006.

### **Carol Wengraf (GBR)**

Tragically passed away on the piste during the Celtic Challenge (in Santiago de Compostella) on June 23, 2012, at the age of 74.

Warm and generous, Carole Wengraf was an excellent fencer, well respected by all her veteran colleagues. She won many national and international medals. Since 2001, she won a medal almost every year at the Great-Britain Veteran Championships. She won the individual silver medal at the 2007 Veteran European Championships, and the individual women sabre gold medal at the 2011 Veteran World Championships, in the 70 years and over category.

### **Fady Tannous (LIB)**

Tragically passed away on the piste on July 14<sup>th</sup> 2012, at the age of 37, during an epee championship organized by the NOC to end a month of sports activities that started with the Olympic Day on June 23<sup>th</sup>.

Secretary General of the Lebanese Fencing Federation, he was also a national champion and an international referee. He was supposed to be part of the Lebanese delegation for the 2012 London Olympic Games as a coach.

**We express our deepest sympathy to the families and federations of the deceased.**

## 1. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

### 1.1 MANAGEMENT

The management activities of the FIE have continued with intensity.

**The Executive Committee** met on September 23, 2011 in Lausanne (SUI), on December 2nd, 2011 in Philadelphia (USA), on March 2nd, 2012 in Lausanne (SUI), and on June 1st, 2012 in Lausanne (SUI),

The **Congress** of the FIE took place in Philadelphia (USA), on December 3rd and 4, 2011.

**14 Executive Committee consultations** were conducted by e-mail when urgent decisions were needed.

The measures adopted by these decision-making bodies were regularly communicated to the FIE members, via **11 Information Letters** and **19 Urgent Letters**.

The letters and their annexes were sent to the National Federations, the Members of Honour, the Members of the Executive Committee and the Presidents of the Confederations by electronic mail.

The various rankings of the FIE were also sent to the National Federations by electronic mail.

## **1.4 ANTI-DOPING**

The fight against doping continued throughout the season and there were **0** case of doping in FIE competitions.

- **286 doping controls were carried out** during the 2011/2012 season at World Cup competitions (not including the World Championships and Zonal Championships), including:
  - 96 controls during Junior World Cups
  - 96 controls during Senior World Cups
  - 60 controls during Team World Cups
  - 34 controls during Satellite Competitions
- The FIE conducted out-of-competition doping controls on 113 athletes.

## **1.5 ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION**

### **1.5.1 Moscow 2012**

The Anti-Doping Awareness Educational Program was a great success in Moscow, and an excellent opportunity for the FIE to inform and educate young fencers from many nations.

A member of the SportAccord *Doping-Free Sport* division came from Lausanne to assist and teach us how to manage this type of educational project. He brought an FIE banner with the logo *Say No! to Doping*, for the FIE stand.

Members of the Russian Anti-Doping Agency, RUSADA, were instrumental in the event's success, providing agents, tables, chairs, as well as educational documents in Russian for the many local participants, and an additional laptop so we could offer the WADA quiz (the highlight of the event) to as many fencers as possible. They even offered us small Russian wooden dolls to offer as prizes to the numerous fencers having scored highly on the quiz.

The FIE offered 200 wristband USB keys which were very popular. These keys contained many documents distributed to most of the participants, so that fencers from 56 nations returned home with the express intention of sharing the quiz, the educational material and the videos with their fencing community.

WADA brochures were also distributed and anti-doping videos were projected, including the WADA video-clip *Say No! to Doping*, which puts fencing in a very positive light!

A daily draw of FIE prizes (the winners chosen among the participants of the day) helped increase the general interest for the awareness program.

Fencers and coaches from many countries tried the quiz, and discussed doping problems with the stand personnel.

### 3. FIE ASSISTANCE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF SPORT

#### **Coaches Training Camp**

The FIE funded a coaches training camp on the European continent, in Budapest from January 7 to 14, 2012.

This training camp was jointly organized with the European Fencing Confederation, at the Zoltan Bernat fencing center in Budapest.

23 coaches, from 14 countries, participated in this training camp, many of them in the three weapons. The countries represented were: Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Denmark, Finland, Georgia, Greece, Ireland, Macedonia, Norway, Latvia, Lithuania, Slovenia and Sweden.

Octavian Zidaru (ROU) and Zoltan Bernat (HUN) taught the course.

#### **I. Athlete training camps**

In 2011-2012, the FIE continued to organize its usual training camps one week before World Championships, and ensured the technical, logistical and financial support of the participants up until the end of the individual events of the Championships, also organized by the FIE.

The first training camp was organised one week before the Catania World Championships, at the Enna University Center (60 km from Catania). Many participants (65 athletes) attended this very successful training camp.

The second training camp was organised one week before the Moscow (RUS) Junior and Cadet World Championships in Russia. It was held in a Sport Center situated 50 km from Moscow. A record number of participants attended; 60 young athletes from 60 different countries attending were invited by the FIE. At the end of the camp, the athletes and the support staff transferred by bus to the Kosmos hotel, official hotel of the World Championships in Moscow.

Organising these training camps has the following objectives:

- encouraging and facilitating the participation of all national federations in the World Championships;
- offering an intensive week of preparation to fencers who do not always have enough training partners to attain a strong international level;
- having these talented youth discover all the content and structure of a modern training session;
- letting them benefit from the advice of very experienced fencing masters, which they will be keen to put into practice;
- ensuring that their first contact with the fencing world elite happens in the best of conditions, in order to encourage them to work twice as hard and become role models once back at their home training base.

#### **II. Coaches training courses**

In 2012, the FIE continued to organize coaching improvement training courses, targeted at high level and national team coaches. These courses were reduced to two weeks, and their content has been modified. It now includes the programming methodology for national team training sessions.

The learning volume is set at 30 hours per week, split into 10 sessions.

Each training course ended with an exam and the awarding of diplomas.

The same type of training course was held for each continent in each weapon.

The FIE provided all the funding for onsite and training expenses.

#### **Europe**

A foil coaching course was organised from May 25 to June 9 2012 in Budapest, Hungary. The FIE asked the national federations to select national coaches or coaches who already took part in the FIE training courses to attend. The (18) countries represented were: Macedonia, Serbia, Portugal, Great-Britain, Belgium, Ireland, Finland, Azerbaijan, Croatia, Bulgaria, Denmark, Slovenia, Slovakia, Norway, Sweden, Latvia, Austria, Georgia. The course was run under the expert leadership of Hugues Leseur (FRA) and Petru Kuki (ROU).

### **Asia**

The same kind of training course was organised for Asia in epee, from May 30 to June 14, 2012 in Tashkent, Uzbekistan. The (24) countries represented were: Jordan, Vietnam, Lebanon, Malaysia, Thailand, Nepal, Iraq, Kazakhstan, India, Iran, Indonesia, Mongolia, Taipei, Turkmenistan, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, Sri Lanka, Syria, Bahrein, Singapore, Cambodia, Australia, and Brunei. The course was taught by Dr. Octavian Zidaru (ROU) and Jerzy Konczalski (POL).

### **America**

For the Americas, the foil training course was organised in April 2011. The (26) countries represented were: Belize, Ecuador, Panama, Argentina, Aruba, Nicaragua, Chile, Honduras, Costa Rica, Paraguay, Curaçao, Colombia, Brazil, Guatemala, Venezuela, Uruguay, Bolivia, Peru, Virgin Islands, Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Cuba, Mexico and El Salvador. The course was run under the expert leadership of Dr. Octavian Zidaru (ROU) and Jerzy Konczalski (POL).

### **Africa**

In Dakar, Senegal, a permanent fencing master school is already in place. This year, the FIE also organised a high level training and updating course for the sabre national coaches in Dakar. The following federations were represented: Guinea, Niger, Togo, Mali, Ivory Coast, Botswana, Gabon, Mauritania, Tunisia, Burkina Faso, Egypt, Morocco, Congo Democratic Republic, Cameroon, Sierra Leone, Nigeria, South Africa and Senegal.

We can safely conclude that these training courses have had a resounding success, with 86 countries representing 5 continents participating.

## **III. Fencing masters training and upgrading schools**

In Dakar, Senegal, the fencing master school created in 1999 perfectly fulfills its role. Without this school, the development of African fencing would have remained an impossible task. The initial objectives of the school were as follows:

- training fencing masters for new African federations;
- updating the skills of the African fencing masters;
- supporting the implementation of new African federations;
- providing high level training for African fencers.

The 7<sup>th</sup> class of the Dakar International School for Fencing Masters (E.I.M.A) started its training on October 15, 2011. The session is planned to end August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2012.

### **Composition of the 7<sup>th</sup> class (2011-2012): 10 students**

The following federations are represented:

- Algeria (2)
- South Africa (1) (female)
- Burkina Faso (2) (including 1 female)
- Cameroon (1)
- Ivory Coast (1)
- Niger (1)
- Togo (1)
- Senegal (1)

The final exams are planned for the second part of August 2012.

Student recruitment is done through a request of candidacies, with participation criteria being sent to all African federations affiliated to the FIE, with a copy to the FIE office. Federations having never sent candidates before have priority.

### **1. The program**

Given the reduced training period, the program was adapted. We thought it necessary to reduce the number of hours spent on secondary subjects, such as anatomy, physiology, training planning, and so on, in order to give more time to fencing specific subjects.

### **2. The infrastructure**

The EIMA is always looking for means of obtaining its own fencing salle. This would allow the students and fencing masters to work longer periods and no longer depend on the availability of the common fencing salle shared by the school and the federation. If successful, the training time reduction would be less consequential.

Until this fencing salle materializes, we have organised a training space in the lodging quarters, where the students can go if the stadium is occupied or if they want to train what they learn in class more in-depth.

A classroom for the theoretical subjects was also arranged in the lodging center.

### **3. The lodging center**

The lodging center is a building with 8 bedrooms capable of hosting up to 12 students. The students reside in single, double or triple rooms, depending on the size of the rooms. The meals are prepared onsite by specialized personnel.

**Training information distribution**

The National Training Director (funded by the OFMA) relays all information pertaining to the events and opportunities, as well as the fencing world and the training, through frequent E-mail communications to all coaches.

**Fencing development in Samoa**

Two OFMA coaches were sent by the OFC to Samoa in October 2011, in order to follow up on the long term communication with local resource persons in the hope of introducing fencing in Samoa and evaluating the viability of its introduction.

The objective was to pursue one of the common goals of the FIE and the OFC, furthering the development of fencing in Oceania. After many discussions these past few years, the OCS decided to take action in this matter.

The mission was successful and our key resource person, Father Hemi Faaefaleupolu, as well as the Secretary General of the Samoan Sport Association and of the Samoan National Olympic Committee (SASNOC), agreed that the Samoan Fencing Association should be established as soon as possible and request its affiliation to the FIE. The OFC worked with Samoa to prepare the necessary documentation.

## **V. Administrative course**

The FIE organized a course for American administrators, and another for African French-speaking administrators.

The FIE funded the following expenses for the first participant of each federation: plane ticket, visa, hotel, breakfast and lunch, and course documentation.

Each participant took a final exam and received a participation diploma.

These courses essentially treated the following subjects:

- composition and functioning of FIE's bodies and the development assistance it provides;
- computer tools, Internet, and the use of the FIE Web site;
- FIE documents and information, and how to easily use them.

The course for the American administrators included 40 participants, and took place in Reno (USA), July 8 to 10, 2011.

The course for the African French-speaking administrators brought together 14 out of 15 Francophone countries, and took place in Catania (ITA), October 14 to 16, 2011.

A course for the European administrators and one for the English-speaking African administrators will be held respectively in September and October 2012.

## **VI. Material Aid** (see the Financial Report)

Thanks to the new program 100 NFF, proposed by the FIE's President, and approved unanimously by the FIE Executive Committee, 105 national federations have received important material support during the 2011-2012 season.

In total, the FIE sent the following to the national federations as gifts:

- 1) 355 fencing pistes;
- 2) 115 top of the line fencing apparatus sets for competitions, finals and training;
- 3) 500 equipment sets including: clothing, masks, electric jackets, gloves, and body wires
- 4) 1,100 weapons (epee, foil, sabre) and blades

The total amount of the material aid given to federations is 989,040 CHF (1,011,310 USD)

This program 100 NFF was a key factor in the development of fencing in the targeted countries. The members of the FIE Executive Committee have approved its results unanimously, and the program will be implemented again in the 2012 – 2013 season.

## **VII. Aid to athletes' participation** (see the Financial Report)

Since 2009, the FIE has been implementing a special program supporting NF athletes who take part in the World Championships. The results speak for themselves: a record number of countries (111) took part in the 2011 Catania World Championships.

All confederations received a grant for each of their national federations corresponding to the expenses (plane ticket and hotel) of one athlete at the 2011 Senior World Championships and another at the 2012 J/C World Championships.

All confederations received a grant for each of their national federations corresponding to the expenses (plane ticket and hotel) of one athlete at the 2011 and 2012 Senior Zone Championships.

### **VIII. Aid to Presidents' participation** (see the Financial Report)

Thanks to the new program of grants (plane ticket and hotel) for NF Presidents, they were able to take part in the works of the FIE Congress, crucial for the development of world fencing. More than one hundred NF Presidents participated in the 2011 FIE Congress in Philadelphia.

### **IX. Aid to the Confederations** (see the Financial Report)

All the confederations received an annual grant, as well as financial aid to organise their 2012 Senior Zone Championships.

### **X. Aid to the competition organisers** (see the Financial Report)

Each national federation that organises an FIE competition (Senior World Cup, Grand Prix, zone-qualifying events) received a grant of 4,400 euros corresponding to the expenses of video-refereeing and wireless.

### **XI. Prizes for the World Champions**

Owing to the FIE President's personal initiative, since 2009 prize funds have been established for World champions. These funds were distributed at the 2011 Senior World Championships in Catania (ITA), at the 2012 J/C World Championships in Moscow (RUS) and at the 2012 World Team Championships in Kiev (UKR).

**In total, the Foundation "For the Future of Fencing" has given 660,000 USD in prizes to the athletes:**

I am pleased to submit for your approval the profit and loss account and the balance sheet for the financial year ending on 30 June 2012, as well as the proposed budget for the financial year July 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014.

I hope this document helps you understand the balance sheet and the profit and loss account.

### **1. INCOME AND EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT**

#### **SUMMARY**

**The income and expenditure accounts for the financial period submitted for your approval show an excess of income over expenditure of CHF 91,648.**

**These balances are CHF 213,698 better than budgeted, with both expenditure and income above budget.**

**This successful financial result is largely due to due the greater than budgeted donation by the President and the recovery in the value of the US dollars in our accounts when measured in Swiss Franc (CHF), our bookkeeping currency.**

## **2: BALANCE SHEET**

### SUMMARY

**Our balance sheet at end-June was satisfactory to maintain a long-term reserve as requested and supported by the President and, with the income and expenditure budgeted over the forthcoming period, to maintain the FIE finances in a healthy state.**

### ASSETS

#### Fixed assets

- 1) Office and computer equipment - The gross value of this equipment, at CHF 898,019, reflects an increase of **CHF 169,731**, of which CHF 149,032 relates to our media programme. This equipment is now written down to CHF 220,900.
- 2) Office furniture – increase in gross value of CHF 13,377, related to the office extension, to a total of **CHF 47,637** (now written down to CHF 11,936).
- 3) Sporting equipment – increase in gross value of CHF 3,644, to **CHF 317,518** (total now valued at CHF 13,863).
- 4) General equipment – increase in gross value of CHF 3,000, to **CHF 10,755**.
- 5) Other fixed assets – **CHF 28,458**, all written off.

**Deposits and guarantees** – no change.

#### **Current assets**

- 1) Stock (ties, scarves, flags) – **CHF 16,053** in value.
- 2) Debtor federations - at **CHF 59,808**, significantly lower than at end-June 2011. The provision against this sum has been set at **CHF 5,853**.
- 3) Accrued income (*Produits à recevoir*) - **CHF 47,324**, which represents payments owed to the FIE.
- 4) Other clients, **CHF 66,093** - payments due for invoices issued by the FIE during the last financial year, the majority consisting of CHF 29,235 of internal FIE transactions between Lausanne and Moscow, etc, CHF 19,817 for TV rights and CHF 17,042 for advertising in our magazine and on our website.

 Excess of income over expenditure (CHF 91,648) is the outcome of the profit and loss account described above. Together with a transfer from the long term reserve (the long term reserve has been modified from CHF 11,371,371 to CHF 10,000,000), this results in capital as of 30 June 2012 of CHF 2,908,336.  
  
 This is augmented by the long-term reserve of CHF 10,000,00, giving a figure for 'TOTAL EQUITY' of CHF 12,908,336
- 2) A provision of CHF 240,500 has been taken out against any reversal in the increase in our equity experienced in 2011-12 caused by fluctuations in currencies.
